

Autism Waiver Service Changes

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Changes To The Waiver

- The State of Kansas received direction from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to move three services from the Autism Waiver to the Medicaid State Plan Amendment.
- The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) and The Kansas Department for Health and Environment (KDHE) have been working to facilitate these changes.

Changes To The Waiver

- The three services moving from the Autism Waiver to the Medicaid State Plan Amendment are:
 - Consultative Clinical and Therapeutic Services (Autism Specialist)
 - Intensive Individual Supports
 - Interpersonal Communication Therapy*
 - *Interpersonal Communication Therapy is covered as speech therapy under the EPSDT provisions.

Changes to the Waiver

- The three services that continue to be part of the Autism Waiver are:
 - Respite Care
 - Family Adjustment Counseling

Parent Support and Training



Changes to the Waiver

- Provider training requirements have updated as follows:
 - The State Approved Training will include more than K-CART training.
 - All services will have a greater range of State Approved trainings.
 - Providers can submit a training they believe meets or exceeds the qualifications of the K-CART training for State review.

Impact on Children with Autism

- More children will be able to receive Autism related services.
 - Children on the Proposed Recipient list who are currently receiving Medicaid will have access to the three State Plan core services*
 - Children from other waivers such as IDD and SED will also have the potential to access the three State Plan Services**.
 - *Medical necessity will still need to be determined for the services to be offered.
 - ** Services from the State Plan cannot duplicate waiver services.

Next Steps

- KDADS/KDHE will compile the comments received today along with all other submitted comments.
 - KDADS/KDHE will address public concern and make changes to the Autism Waiver/State Plan Amendment as needed.

Next Steps

 The Autism Waiver and State Plan Amendments will be submitted to CMS for approval. KDADS/KDHE will work with all Kansas partners to ensure a smooth and functional transfer of services from the Autism Waiver to the State Plan Amendment.
