We are proud to offer our services in collaboration with these partners: Wyandot Center, Johnson County Mental Health Center, Heartland Regional Alcohol and Drug Assessment Center, and the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services.

RSI is part of the Wyandot Behavioral Health Network of organizations serving Wyandotte County with comprehensive behavioral health services. Wyandot BHN offers services to individuals and families regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, age, gender, disability, sexual orientation or veteran status. We accept Medicaid, Medicare, and private insurance. Wyandot BHN also offers services at a reduced, set fee, or at no cost, based on clinical need for persons who qualify. Who we help

RSI offers 24/7 services for Wyandotte and Johnson County adult residents (18 and older) who need non-medical help for a mental health or substance use crisis.

We exist to provide care and treatment to individuals who are experiencing mental health or substance use issues that require immediate attention. We aim to quickly resolve the crisis, connect people with community-based services, and reduce the number of unnecessary hospitalizations and arrests.

RSI is not equipped to deal with medical emergencies. For medical emergencies, **call 911**.





How to access RSI services

Law enforcement, healthcare facilities, and social service organizations frequently encounter persons experiencing a mental health or substance use crisis. RSI is a resource for these organizations to turn to when they do not feel equipped to respond to the crisis at hand.

Individuals in crisis may also walk in to RSI, or family members and friends can bring a loved one in for care.

How RSI helps

When individuals arrive at RSI, our staff of mental health professionals assess the urgency of their crisis then determine the next steps required to address it.

For those experiencing a substance use crisis, we provide a Sobering Unit for up to 10-hour stays. Before these individuals leave RSI, we offer recovery support and referrals to other treatment services.

Those with a mental health crisis enter our Crisis Observation Unit for up to 23 hours to help alleviate symptoms. We then connect the people we serve to community mental health centers for follow-up services.

Our Crisis Stabilization Unit is available for up to 10 days for individuals who require

more care and treatment before they move to community-based care.
