RT is the most commonly used non-pharmacological therapy in Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia. RT has been shown in published clinical studies to have various behavioral, cognitive, psychological, and functional benefits in individuals with Alzheimer's and other dementias. Specifically, RT has been reported to reduce depression, - agitation, apathy, and loneliness and to improve cognitive performance behavioral functioning, mood, communication, interaction, life satisfaction, well-being, self-esteem, activities of daily living, and social activities.
