Patient Visitor Guidelines

Visiting Hours:

Monday through Friday: 3:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Saturday, Sunday, and Holidays: 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.to 9:00 p.m.

Ages and Number of Visitors:

A patient may have two (2) visitors at a time. All visitors must be at least 14 years of age. Exceptions to these guidelines must be approved by the patient's Treatment Team or the Nursing Supervisor in the event the Treatment Team is unavailable.

General Guidelines:

- Visitors may not bring contraband to a patient who is in the hospital. (See reverse side for categories and examples.)
- Purses, backpacks, packages or bags are not allowed in the visiting area. These items should be left in the visitor's locked vehicle.
- Items / packages cannot be given directly to patients.
 - Any food and drink being brought into the facility must be single service items that were preapproved to be consumed during the visit. All other items brought for a patient must be left at the OSH Fire Station
 - Security will search and log the items/packages and are directed to handle contraband and non-compliant items as per hospital policies.
 - Once searched and cleared items will be delivered by security to the patient's unit to be given to the patient or stored until discharge.
- Communication devices (e.g. cell phones, tablets) are not allowed in the visiting area or around patients and should remain in the visitor's locked vehicle.
- Audio and video recording devices (e.g. cameras, video recorders, audio recorders) are strictly
 prohibited unless approved by the Superintendent or Chief Executive Officer or designee.
- Visitors must respect the privacy, confidentiality and dignity of all patients. Visitors must not
 discuss any patient with others. Abuse, neglect or exploitation of any patient will not be
 tolerated.
- Food or drink that will be consumed by the patient during a visit must be approved at least 24 hours in advance by the treatment team for special events on a case-by-case basis.
- Visitors must follow instructions from any hospital staff member. A visitor may ask to discuss any concerns with the Nursing Supervisor on duty.
- Visitors are subject to wanding to ensure the safety of all patients, staff, and visitors. If refusal of wanding the visit will not be able to take place as scheduled.
- Visitors must read and follow instructions from the Maintaining Safety on the Unit training posted on the bulletin board at the OSH Fire Station.

I, ________, have not been a patient at OSH/AAC within the last 180 days. I agree that if I consented to restrict my physical access to the OSH/AAC campus that an OSH/AAC staff member may permit me to write a letter to the person(s) I sought to visit in lieu of visiting with a current OSH/AAC patient(s). I understand that after I have permitted 180 days to pass after my most recent discharge that I may visit patient(s) if there is agreement from the patient(s) to have face to face visitors at OSH/AAC.—I also understand that signing this form is voluntary.

The following list includes categories of contraband and examples. Patients are not allowed to possess contraband while at the Hospital.
